Pineapple Cheese Buffet Mold



Refreshing Pineapple In A Creamy, Cool Gelatin Pineapple and cheese have always been a popular combination either as dessert or salad. Here they are together in a delicious mold which will add elegance to buffets or play a leading role at

Pleasing color contrasts are introduced with a garnish of pine-apple slices, crabapples and grapefruit sections.

Pineapple Cheese Buffet Mold 2 cups small-curd cottage cheese 1/4 cup snipped chives (optional) 1 (8-ounce) package cream cheese 1 envelope unflavored gelatin
1/4 cup cold water
1/2 cups drained pineapple
tidbits 1 cup whipping cream Salad greens

piced crabapples 3/4 cup chopped salted mixed nuts Mash cheeses together with fork until smooth. Soften gelatin in cold water in a small measuring cup. Set cup in hot water until gelatin melts. Stir into cheese. Add pineapple, salted nuts and chives. Whip cream and fold into mixture. Put in oiled 6-cup mold. Chill at least 4 to 6 hours (this is a soft mixture and will not become hard like a regular gelatin mold). Unmold on large salad plate and surround with salad greens and chilled fruits. If dressing is desired, thin mayonnaise with a little pineapple syrup to serve with it. Serves at least 8.


