(READ THESE RULES)

1. Entries for Class J are limited to boys and girls enrolled in 4-H clubs in Holt county.
2. All entries in this class will clear through the County Agent's office. All entries shall be made through the local club leader or fair superintendents.
3. Exhibits must represent the exhibitor's own work accomplished since the last fair.
4. Four-H club members may show in 4-H club class without purchasing an exhibitor's ticket but an exhibitor's ticket will be required to exhibit in open class.
5. Only articles mentioned in the premium list will be eligible to receive premiums.
6. No premium money will be paid by the management until the 4-H final reports are received in the County Agent's office.
7. In case of only one entry, prize shall be awarded on quality.
8. All possible diligence and care will be used to prevent loss or injury to exhibits, but the management of the fair will in no way be responsible should loss or injury occur. Each club is responsible for entering and removing exhibits.
9. See general rules for removal of exhibits.

Entry Rules

Four-H livestock may be entered any time before and up to 6 p.m. Monday, August 18, 1958. Those wishing to enter by mail please send entries to HENRY WOOD, superintendent of livestock, Ewing, Nebraska.

All livestock to be in place and ready for judging Tuesday, August 19, 1958, by 9 a.m.

Agricultural home economics and all other 4-H exhibit entries to be entered and in place by 6 p.m., Monday, August 18. Judging to take place on Tuesday, August 19.

Judging of individual and team demonstrations, home economics judging contests to take place on Wednesday, August 20.

Livestock judging to be Tuesday, August 19.

LOT 1

Individual and Team Demonstrations

Wednesday, August 20, 9 a.m. A team demonstration shall consist of two members of the same standard boys' or girls' 4-H club in which the record of each member is up-to-date at fair time. Individual demonstrations may be given by any individual in their own project. Team demonstrations should not be less than 15 minutes or more than 30 minutes in length. Individual demonstrations not less than 10 minutes nor more than 20. Judges' questions only will be scored in competitive demonstrations. Home economics and agricultural demonstrations will start at 9 a.m. on August 20. Premiums are as follows:

Judging Contests

Wednesday, August 20, 9:30 a.m. Only members regularly enrolled in a home economics project may compete for prizes in the contest. Agriculture and home economics judging will be on Wednesday, August 20.

Livestock and dairy judging will be held at 3:00 p.m. on Tuesday, August 19.

There will be two divisions in both agriculture and home economics. The Junior Division, under 12, and the Senior Division 12 and over. Premiums will be awarded as follows:

Any member showing either dairy or beef animals, swine or sheep, is entitled to enter this contest regardless of placing. Judging will be done on the basis of ability to fit and show the animal.

First 3 places in each division to come back and compete for finals, for Ak-Sar-Ben awards.

All members showing will be judged for showmanship while they are showing their livestock. Finals will be run last to determine the winners in each division, 4-H and FFA.

Showmanship contest will be set up in swine and sheep division in snow warrants. Blue \$1.00; red, \$1; white, 50c. One division only.

Special Awards

A special herdsmanship award will be set up. In addition purple, blue, red and white ribbons will be given the four high individuals.

Tractor Driving Contest

For 4-H members. Judged on proper handling of tractor, safety precautions and maintenance. Entries are limited to tractor club members. Contest will be held on Wednesday afternoon.

Livestock Judging

All livestock will be judged and placed according to the Danish system, which is blue ribbon, red ribbon and white ribbon groups. In addition, a purple group will be selected from the blue awards in each class if the judge feels the show warrants.

LOT 4—CATTLE

Only two animals can be shown in any class by a club member. Note: Such as Angus steer, Angus heifer, Hereford steer, Hereford heifer, etc.

Any club member having more will have to choose the animals to be exhibited. Hay and space will be furnished free for the calves owned by club members that are not to be exhibited. Only the calves originally earmarked may be shown.

Any class of market cattle may be divided by weight if show warrants.

Entries may be made in advance or on Monday, August 18, with Henry Wood of Ewing. All animals must be in place and ready to show by 9 a.m., Tuesday.

SPECIAL AWARDS

Chambers Commercial Club

The Chambers Commercial Club is again this year giving cups in the 4-H classes. These cups to go to the animals judged best in their class picked from the purple ribbon winners in each class regardless of breed.

Breeding Heifers

Only heifers that have been tattooed may be shown—must be registered or eligible for registry. The following classes are set up, each class to compete by breeds: Blue, red and white groups, \$5, \$4, \$3, and all others shown, \$1.

1. Purebred heifer calf under 6 months old — Blue, Red, White
2. Purebred heifer calf, 6 months to 1 year — Blue, Red, White
3. Purebred heifer, 1 year, under 2 years — Blue, Red, White
3. Purebred — Blue, Red, White
4. Purebred bred heifer. Blue, Red, White Blue \$5; Red, \$4; White, \$3; and all others \$1.
