clubs. There also may be posters by individuals on how to control noxious and troublesome weeds.

RULES
Any club can take part. The display is to include 15 different weeds. TWO of which must be noxious weeds. All weeds shall be mounted in order of difficulty to eradicate. Under each give short comment as to its difficulty of eradication. Also classification as to annual, biannual or perennial. The display shall be made on beaver or other rigid light board, 2 1/2 ft. by 4 ft. The Club Name must be on the front of the display in letters 2 inches high.

CROP SPECIALS Range Management

Members of the range management and Conservation Clubs may exhibit their individual grass books that are a result of the current year's work. A minimum of 10 grasses must be included in the display. Second or third year grass projects that contain previous years project grasses will be judged only on the grasses of the current project year. The grasses exhibited must conform with these required in the project manual and be labeled in the lower right hand corner of each sheet. A short paragraph of about 50 words stating the value and importance on the range land for each of these grasses should be centered on the back of the page opposite of the grass exhibited. Minimum size of the display book is 12" wide and 18" high. Maximum size 16" x 24" high. Holt County Soil and Water Conservation District will give \$5, \$3, \$2, for the top 3 individual Range Grass books.

Members of Range Management and Conservation 4-H Clubs may exhibit the plant-presses built as a requirement of their club projects. Plant presses will be judged on neatness, usefulness and originality.

AK-SAR-BEN

1958 AK-SAR-BEN SPECIAL AWARDS

Ak-Sar-Ben will again, make special awards for 4-H club exhibitors at Nebraska county fairs. No more than four awards nor more than four recipients permitted in any class. Counties operating under a modified Danish system may use the total monies offered for each class, and divide among the four top-ranking exhibitors in each class as the show warrants.

Ribbons for the following awards will be given by Ak-Sar-Ben.

In divisions IX, X, XI and XII, winners will be determined by total points earned. Each first place or blue award will count five points; second place or red award, four points; third place or white award, three points; fourth place, two points, and fifth place, one point.

In division IX, X and XII, exhibitors are only eligible to compete in the class embodying the project they are carrying in their club.

With the exception of the team demonstrations, all contests are open to individual club members.

First award will be given a blue ribbon; second, red; third, white; fourth, pink.

Read These Rules

1. Entries are limited to boys enrolled in Voc. Ag. in Holt County.
2. All entries in this class will clear through the Atkinson or O'Neil Voc. Ag. Departments.
3. Exhibits must represent the exhibitor's own work or own product.
4. Only articles mentioned in the premium list will be eligible to receive premiums.
5. In case of only one entry the exhibit shall receive the award recommended by the judge.
6. All possible diligence and care will be used to prevent loss or injury to exhibits, but the management of the fair will in no way be responsible should loss or injury occur.
7. See general rules for removal of exhibits.

LOT 1
Livestock Showman Contest
Same as lot 2 of 4-H.

LOT 2
Livestock Judging Contest
Any member showing either dairy or beef animals, swine or sheep is eligible to enter this contest regardless of placing. Judging will be done on the basis of ability to fit and show the animal.
Blue, 2; Red, 1.50; White, \$1.

All members showing will be judged for showmanship while they are showing their livestock. Finals will be run last to determine the winners.

Showmanship contest will be set up in swine and sheep divisions if show warrants.

Blue, \$1.50; Red, \$1; White, 75c.
All livestock will be judged and placed according to the Danish System which is blue ribbon, red ribbon and white ribbon groups. In addition, a purple group will be selected from the blue awards in each class if the judge feels the show warrants.

LOT 3
