Rodeo is now truly a national sport. The world's biggest total sport. The world's biggest total purse is paid off each fall at Madison Square Garden, which put up \$78,300 in 1958. The world's biggest day money is paid off at the Los Angeles Coliseum, where the Sheriff's Rodeo posted a total purse of \$12,500 for one day contest in 1958.

63-YEAR-OLD VET

Most veteran of all rodeo con-testants still active is 63-year old steer roper Ike Rude of Brawley, Calif., who entered his first rodeo in Magnum, Okla., in 1910. Older, but slightly less experienced, is team roper John Rhodes, Tuscon, still active at 71. Rhodes, however, didn't get around to entering a rodeo until 1915.

Rodeo can be correctly nounced either ro-Day-o, after the Spanish origin of the term, or RO-dee-o. The first form is more common in California and the Southwest, where Spanish pronunciation of Spanish terms per-sists. But the latter is preferred by rodeo contestants themselves.

The earliest known rodeo trophy was the Citizen's Prize, handsome silver plaque won in 1888 by Juan Levias at the first Frontier Days in Prescott, Ariz.

Rodeo is the only sport in the nation awarding national championships on both the high school and college levels.
