Hobbs told authorities he was traveling at about 45 mph when he came upon the warning sign. He stated that he shifted into a lower gear and applied the brakes. The load shifted, Hobbs said, and caused the upset.
The warning sign advises motorists the maximum speed of the curve is 30 mph.

A collision between a car and truck took place Monday on East Douglas street in front of the Shelhamer Equipment building.
