There will be 1,400-1,600 head of cattle here today (Thursday) for the regular weekly sale.

This offering—biggest of the season—will include from 800 to one thousand calves, mostly whiteface. Quite a few of these will be load lots. Balance of the sale will be yearling heifers and yearling steers, also quite a few fat cows. The quality of these fresh, sandhills cattle will be the best, including many light calves which the feeders will be wanting. Hog sale starts at twelve o'clock noon; cattle sale about 1:30.

This will also be the biggest week of the year because the following day—Friday, October 24—is the black Friday sale—the third, 800 to 1,000 top steer and heifer calves, 300 to 500 yearling steers and heifers, and 15 4-H calves.
