Double A Auctions

Atkinson Tuesday, October 21st
Cattle receipts ran heavy to spring calves as buyer resistance was noted for the first time this season, the market wasn't quite as mean as the wind that blew, however losses were noted on all classes of calves over our good auction of a week ago. A long string of 180 choice steer calves were the stand-out of the sale weighing from 350 to 400 lbs. and selling from \$37.10 to \$39.75 cwt. These belonged to Wm. Langan and Sons, O'Neill.

Other choice calves sold largely from \$35.50 to \$38.00 with their heifer mates at \$29.00 to \$32.00 cwt. Only a few were able to better these prices. However all consignments were smaller and in many instances quality was not up to previous sales. Just good kinds of calves eligible to bring \$2.00 to \$3.00 cwt. under the above prices.

On the yearling weight classes action was good with most kinds selling on a largely steady basis, at \$26.00 to \$27.75 with only the extreme weightier kinds and the cornfield variety under \$25.50 cwt. Yearling heifers in short supply largely \$24.50 to \$26.50 cwt. Cow market active and strong to 25¢ cwt. higher.
