### CLEANING STAINLESS



Stainless steel is one of the easiest materials to clean and keep clean. Its hard, tough surface is resistant to wear, and does not develop rough spots that harbor bacteria.

Hot water and soap or detergent will do most cleaning jobs in a flash. Thorough rinsing and drying prevent white "water spots," which are actually mineral deposits from the tap water.

If burned-on foods do not succumb to soap and water, try a paste made with ammonia and water and a fine scouring powder.

Sometimes overheating may cause dark spots or "heat tint" on pots and pans. This doesn't harm the metal, but can be removed by scouring with stainless steel wool in combination with a mild abrasive powder or one of several commercial removers.

Easier than removal, however, is prevention: Use even heat when cooking, and don't apply heat to empty equipment.

Since stainless steel is solid all the way through, it will never chip, peel or wear thin. Stainless actually becomes tougher with use, and with normal care, your stainless steel cookware will stay bright as new through years of constant service.
