

A notice posted in district court at O'Neill by the United States department of justice, immigration and naturalization service requires that every alien must report his that every alien must report his Sawyer's class of beginners in Sawyer's class of

in 30 days following such date, report his address to the commissioner of immigration and naturalization service, and shall furnish such additional information as may be required by regulations.

Any alien who is temporarily bsent from the United States during the reporting period shall report his address within 10 days after his return to the United

Any alien who willfully or inexcusably fails to report as required is liable to be taken into custody and deported. In addition, imprisonment or fines may be evied before deportation.
