SUGGESTION: Apricot Braid for Your Gift List

How about putting this apricot braid on your Christmas gift list? Friends will love the fruit filled yeast bread, Bill Perry, supervisor of the local Meadow Gold Dairy, assures us.

Although it takes time to make it, according to Beatrice Cooke, director of the test kitchens in Chicago where the recipe was created, it is a lot of fun too.

APRICOT BRAID
(Makes 1 large braid)
1/4 cup milk, scalded
1/4 cup butter
1/4 cup sugar
1/2 teaspoon salt
1/4 cup warm water
1-ounce package active dry yeast
1 egg, beaten
4 to 4 1/2 cups sifted flour
Apricot Filling
1 cup chopped cooked dried apricots
1-3 cup brown sugar, firmly packed
2-3 cup water
1/2 cup chopped nuts
1 tablespoon lemon juice
Glaze
1 egg yolk, slightly beaten with 2 tablespoons milk
Crumbs Mixture
2 1/2 tablespoons flour
1 tablespoon sugar
1/4 teaspoon cinnamon
1 tablespoon butter
Combine milk, butter, sugar and salt; stir until dissolved. Cool to lukewarm. Combine yeast and water; stir until dissolved. Stir in milk mixture and the egg; mix well. Add flour gradually; beat until smooth. Turn out on lightly floured surface and knead until smooth and elastic. Put in greased bowl, brush top with melted butter, cover and let rise in warm place until double in bulk. Punch down and turn out on lightly floured surface. Roll out in shape of rectangle 8 by 16 inches. Place on greased cookie sheet.

Make apricot filling by combining filling ingredients in a saucepan. Bring to a boil and simmer about 5-10 minutes, or until thick, stirring occasionally. Cool; then spoon the apricot filling down center third of side of filling to edges of dough. Fold strips at an angle across filling, alternating from side to side. Cover; let rise until double in bulk.

Brush with glaze. Sprinkle with crumbs mixture. (Make crumbs mixture by mixing flour, sugar and cinnamon, then cut in butter until mixture is crumbly.) Bake at 350 degrees for 30-35 minutes.
