Old Time Resident Dies At 82 Friday

The death of Mrs. L. M. Tindall, aged 82 years, 9 months, occurred in Neilberg Hospital Monday, Feb. 9th, 1959, following a brief illness. Mrs. Tindall previously had enjoyed good health and with her husband was residing at the Senior Citizen's Apts. She was very active, doing her own house work and shopping. She was a regular attendant at the United Church and a member of W.A. Homemakers, and Eastern Star. Margaret (Maggie) Willows Tindall was born in Minn. June 27, 1876. At the age of seven she with her folks, came by covered wagon to Knoxville, Nebr. She taught school for 10 years. In April, 1908, she married Louis M. Tindall. They farmed near Knoxville until 1911 when they moved to Kindersley, Canada. In 1935 they retired and moved to Neilburg. Surviving are her husband and two sons, Marshall of Lloyd and Frank of Marsden, one sister, Sadie who lives in Washington, U.S.A.
