Chambers Feature

Deer Like Chambers Community; Increasing Numbers Are Seen

A number of deer have found a home to their liking in the shelter belts near Chambers.

On the Donald Dankert place, just one mile north of town, from nine to fifteen deer have been seen at various times. About four or five years ago a doe and two fawn were first seen by the Dankerts. It is thought this was the start of the herd which now numbers at least fifteen. They are more often seen in groups of six and nine. Mr. and Mrs. E. A. Farrier, living one mile west of Dankerts and Mr. and Mrs. Louis Walter, a mile north, report seeing them often. Mrs. A. A. Walter two miles west, was also privileged to see six just across the road from her house only a short time ago.

These deer weed throughout the winter on the alfalfa fields occasionally helping themselves to some from the stacks. At the Farrier place they have discovered where some corn had been piled earlier and when the snow in on they dig down for the choice bits of shelled corn still on the ground. The fine shelter belts in this vicinity furnish ample winter protection as well as summer shade.

The deer are often seen during the haying season, but their coloring blends so closely with nature that they are not always noticed even when quite close. One buck deer stood quietly near a hay stack while a combine made several rounds in the field. The driver of the tractor missed seeing him, though others in the field were well aware of his presence.

One morning last week, Mrs. Farrier called this reporter to say they were then standing at their east window watching nine deer sunning themselves a little distance from the house. Asked if they have been a nuisance or have destroyed any vegetation the answer is no. Seemingly there is plenty for them to thrive on in this hay valley without the need of foraging on farm ground or gardens.

All who see them are thrilled at their race and beauty. None of those questioned would permit any harm to come to their deer.
