Mayzie Beatrice Brumbaugh, daughter of Bliss and Idilla Brumbaugh was born at Valparaiso, Pa. on Sept. 23, 1879. In 1881, at the early age of one and one half years, she came with her family by covered wagon to Saunders County, Nebr. The next year 1882, they came to Holt Co. where her father Elias Brumbaugh took a Government homestead, two miles south and a half mile west of Inman, where she resided many years of her life. She passed away in St. Anthony's hospital Thursday evening, March 19, 1959 after a few months of illness, at the age of seventy nine years, five months and twenty six days.

On Nov. 11, 1896 she was united in marriage to William C. Kelley, at the home of her parents by Rev. McCutcheon of O'Neill. To this union was born nine children, two of these children Don and Dertha preceded their mother in death.
