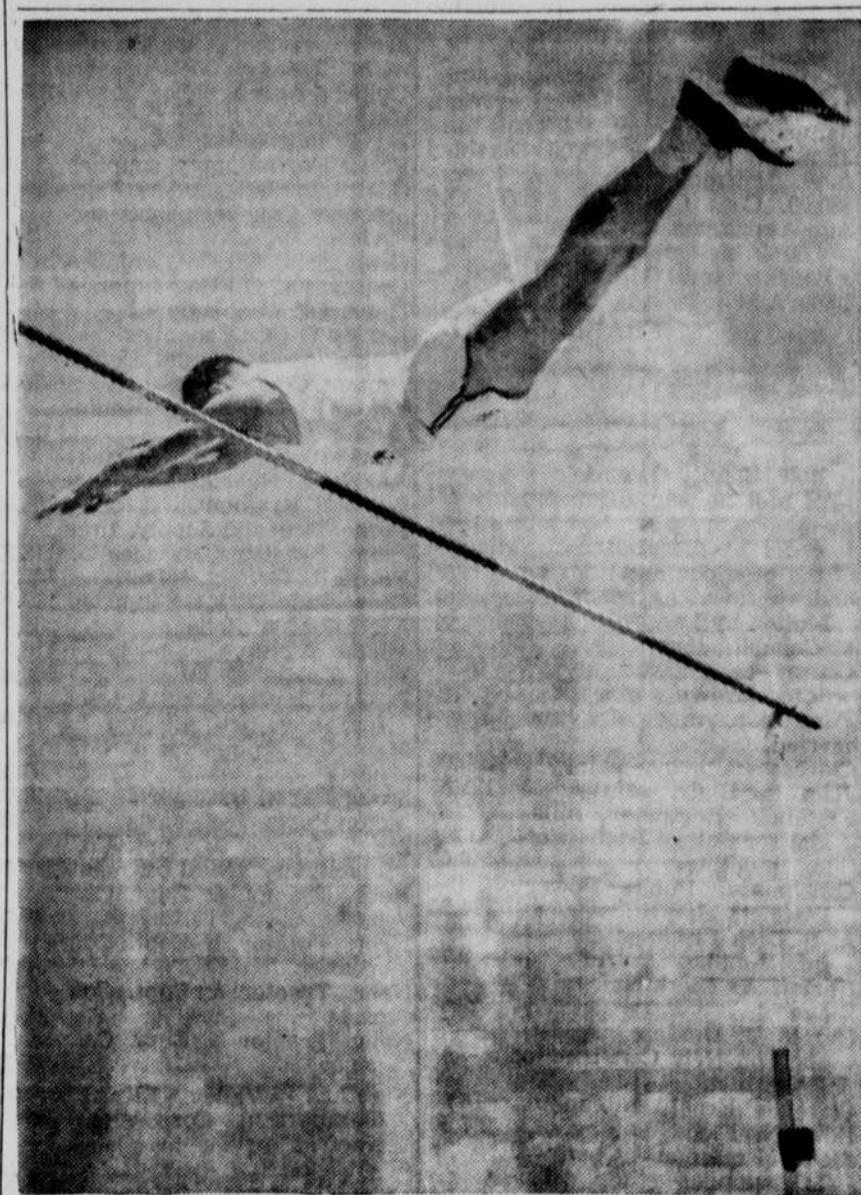
O'Neill Boys Limber For First Meet; Tomlinson, Oetter, Eby Show Well

St. Mary's Academy led the class B teams and won a trophy for team effort. They came in sixth while O'Neill high came in seventh. (See complete team results on this page.)

One of the finest displays of throwing the 12 pound shot was turned in by Larry Tomlinson, a St. Mary's senior.

Tomlinson threw the shot 50 feet and 11 inches (see picture) as a roar went up from the crowd. Tomlinson also came in second in the discus throw.

Coach Don Templemeyer had high praise for Tomlinson when he said:

"In competition, Larry has never yet thrown the shot but what he has bent his own mark by at least a foot. He is one of the finest competitors I have ever seen."

Sharing first place individual honors was Bob Eby of O'Neill who tied for first place in the high jump with Humphrey of Mullen.

Larry Oetter of O'Neill High turned in a fine day at the broad jumping pits with a leap of 20 feet to come in second.
