




In response to the many inquiries, we wish to explain why Emerald cut diamond offers more carat weight, quality and cost being the same—up to 1½ carat.

A rough diamond of 100% will produce 60% finished weight when emerald cut, the brilliant (round) will finish 51%, and the Marquise will produce 36% finished weight. In other words the amount polished away is included in the cost of the diamond and the emerald cut loses less of its original weight in cutting. Beyond 11/2 carats all three styles cost approximately the same per carat-quality being the same.
