Cal Stewart Returns; Tells of Project

Carroll (Cal) Stewart, former editor-publisher of The Frontier, returned Friday to spend a week with his family here.

Stewart and the family vacationed five weeks during February and March. Mrs. Stewart and the children returned in April and Mr. Stewart began research on a proposed book concerning the August 1, 1943, low-level bombing of the Ploesti (Rumania) oil fields. Although he did not fly the mission, Stewart was a member of one of the participating groups. He knew several hundred men who flew the mission and the proposed book is a closeup, intimate story which has never been published.

Stewart's research has been at

the Library of Congress in Washington and at the Air Force historical archives at Maxwell Air Force Base at Montgomery, Ala.

Co-author of the proposed book is James Dugan, who wrote "The Great Iron Ship", a best-seller in 1954; "Man Under the Sea," which was published in 1956 and subsequently in seven languages, and he wrote the documentary film, "The Silent World", an academy award winner in 1957.
