ROAD PETITION
TO THE HONORABLE COUNTY BOARD OF HOLT COUNTY, NEBRASKA.

We, the undersigned, electors of Holt County, Nebraska, residing within five miles of the following described road, hereby petition your honorable body to establish a public road 66 feet wide, described as follows, to-wit:

Commencing at the Northeast Corner of Section 19, Township 29, Range 9, West of the 6th P.M., in Holt County, Nebraska, running thence South a fraction of a mile to connect with State Highway 20.

After discussion the Board decided to make inspection of the road. 12:00 Noon. On motion the Board adjourned until 1:00 P.M.

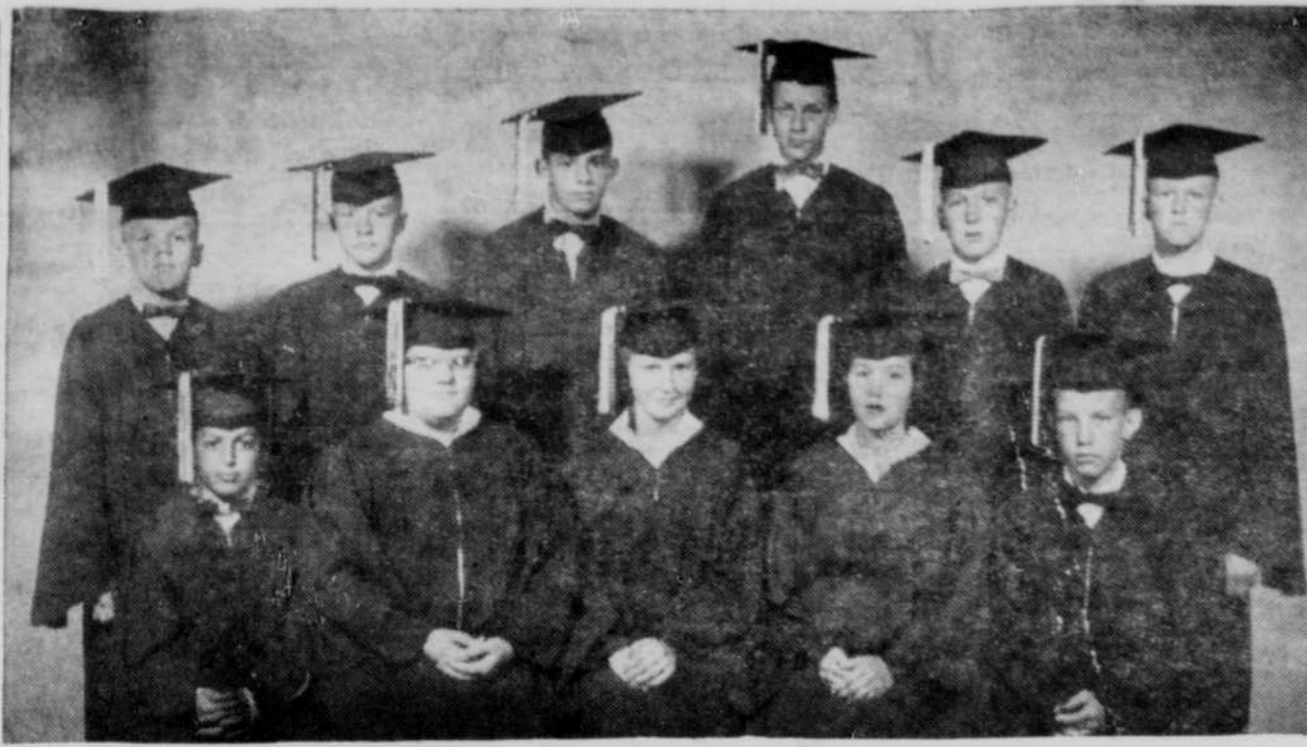

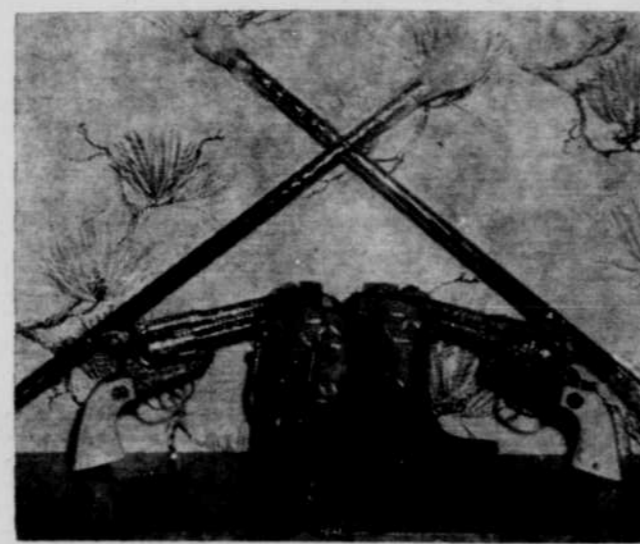
