## College Degree for Mother of 8

Mrs. Florence Schultz has had a busy 13 years. She has reared a family of eight children (only two of them are still at home), and since 1942 has acquired a high school education by extension, a bachelor of arts degree by successive summer sessions at Wayne college, and, in addition to all these things, she has held down a teaching job on the O'Neill public school faculty.

Mrs. Schultz and her children were residing on an acreage a quarter of a mile from the Rock Falls school. The children went to school and the mother tended a few chickens and a couple of cows.

When her oldest child finished O'Neill high school in 1942, Mrs. Schultz began high school training by extension from the University of Nebraska. By 1945 she had received her high school diploma and was a qualified normal teacher. Her first job was in rural district 33, northwest of O'Neill.

In 1947 she moved her family into O'Neill and was spending her summers at Wayne State Teachers college, slowly building up credits and qualifications.

In 1948 she joined the O'Neill public school teaching staff, and for five years worked in a special room. During the past two years she has been teaching 25 pupils composed of first and second graders.

Supt. D. E. Nelson said Mrs. Schultz is a "thorough, good and conscientious teacher."

Although she does not have her bachelor's degree in hand, the president of the college has listed her as a candidate for a degree this summer and on the campus they regard her as a graduate.

The mother of eight resides at Nelhardt hall with other coeds and usually makes the 100-mile trek to O'Neill for the weekends.

Mrs. Schultz has been re-elected to teach again next fall in the O'Neill system at a bi-annual salary.
