Medium and common kinds 15.00 to 17.00. Trashy kinds 12.50 to 13.00. Heifers generally 50 cents lower with the top of 17.20 on loads. Stocker heifers 14.00 to 15.00.

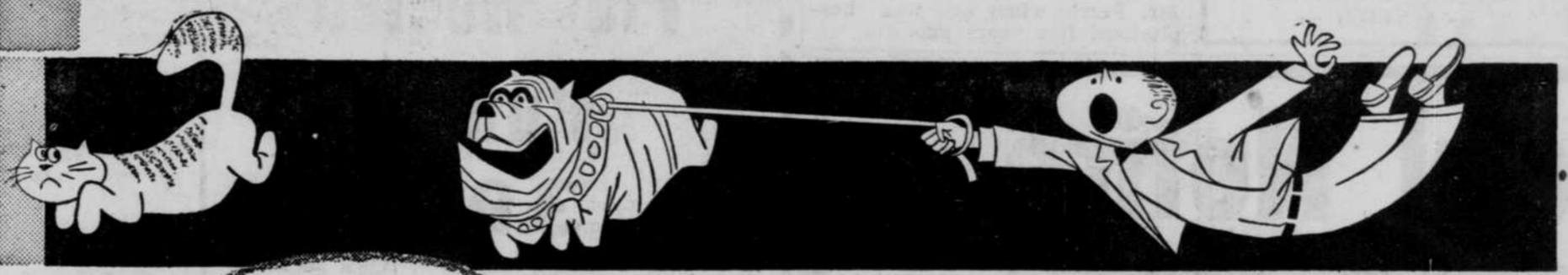
