(Continued from page 1) tiffs did not have a case, and gave the rancher group 10 days in which to amend their pleadings to show a case, else face a dismissal.

Until Wednesday no amendments or alterations had been made. Next step is a court order for dismissal or an appeal to the state supreme court.

Griffin said the attorney-general's office has studied and followed the matter closely.

Attorney Lee said if a final dismissal order is issued his plaintiffs "most certainly" will appeal the petition in its original form.
