TAXPAYERS NOTICE

It is erroneous that inventories can be assessed at 70% of cost.

It is the position of the Governor and the State Tax Commissioners that reporting merchandise inventories at 70% of cost is illegal and should not be approved by the assessors who know the procedure is being followed.

All foreign corporations stocks and shares must be listed by the Tax Commission's office and any found omitted will be taxed at the same rate as personal property. If they are listed they are taxed at 40c per hundred.

All schedules are due April 20, 1954, and become delinquent after that date.
