

Weekly Market Report

The Atkinson Livestock Market Atkinson, Nebraska

Tuesday, April 20th Auction

Cattle receipts totaled 1,887 head. A fat cattle market which strengthened last week coupled with recent rains in the corn belt and plains area, gave the feeder cattle market a boost today. All classes sold higher, advances were from \$1.00-\$2.00 cwt. with heifers having the greatest upturn:

Several straight loads of steers sold with some 570-lb. choice steers topping the sale at \$22.55. All the high good and choice kinds sold from \$21.00 to \$22'50. Better than average steers \$19.00-\$20.75 with some crossbreds down to \$17.40. All the steer grades shared in the market advance-looked like a full \$1.00 cwt. improvement.

In heifer sales the strongest action of the year was shown as buyers took the offerings at prices mainly \$1.50-\$2.00 cwt. higher than a week ago. Good and choice kinds \$18.00-\$19.0) with a large run of heifers in this class. Just good kinds were bringing \$17.00-\$17.75, very few below the latter figure.

A splendid offering of breeding cows with calves at side from the Guy Parsons Ranch averaged \$154.00 a pair. Other cows close to calving from \$127.50-\$245.00 per head.

Butcher cattle showed the least change from a week ago. Canners and cutters 25 to 50 cents higher, \$8.25 to \$9.50. Beef cows \$10.00 to \$12.25 cwt. Bulls mainly steady, \$12.00-\$13.50 cwt.
