



Wheeler Tax Take for '52 Is 100%

State Auditor Ray C. Johnson stated in Linclon this week that Wheeler county for the third time has made a 100 percent collection of personal taxes. Wheeler County Attorney Ar-


thur O. Auserod reported to Johnson that County Treasurer S. L. Westcott and Sheriff Arthur McLain have just completed the job of collecting all 1952 taxes. Previous 100 percent collections in Wheeler county were of 1945

and 1951 personal taxes. Thirty-two distress warrants were isued by the treasurer and delivered to the sheriff last October in connection with the 1952 collection.

Of the 93 counties in the state, Wheeler is the only one ever to report 100 percent collection, ohnson commented.
