Referendum Outcome Will Not Affect Allotments—Friday, July 23, at three different polling places, wheat growers of Holt county will vote for or against marketing quotas for the 1955 crop.

The referendum, according to Harry E. Ressel, chairman of the Holt county agricultural stabilization and conservation committee, will determine whether or not the quota program now in effect will continue for next year's crop.

Chairman Ressel urges every eligible wheat grower in Holt county to vote. A producer is eligible to vote if he will have more than 15 acres of wheat on his farm for harvest in 1955.

Suggestions for Aiding Sun Victim Prolonged summer heat or overexposure to the sun are liable to cause upsets to the body's heat-regulating system.

Such conditions as sunstrokes, heatstrokes or heat prostration may occur when the body is exposed to excess heat. It is important to know what to do as a first aid measure when these conditions arise.

When a person collapses in hot weather, it is advised that a doctor be called at once. The victim should be moved into the shade and any tight clothing loosened.

For heat prostration, keep the victim's head low, and warm his body. Even though the weather is hot, cover him with blankets and put hot water bottles around him.
