**'Dancing Waters' Radio City Hit**

LINCOLN—"Dancing Waters," an amazing and beautiful new type of show, will be presented for the first time in this area during the Nebraska state fair, September 5-10. It will be the only appearance in Nebraska during 1954, according to Fair Board Secretary Ed Schultz.

"Dancing Waters" is a combination of water, electric power, lights, music and showmanship, developed through many years of intensive research at a cost of a quarter of a million dollars.

Invented and perfected in Europe, the spectacular show was first presented at the West Berlin industrial exposition in the summer of 1952. It caused an immediate sensation and played to 300,000 patrons in 10 days.

It was then booked into Radio City music hall in New York, opening on January 15, 1953. After playing four smash weeks, the show was rebooked for the hall's Easter show — the first time in the music hall's history that any attraction had been repeated in so short a time.

Performances of "Dancing Waters" will be presented continuously each afternoon and evening during the state fair.

**Hard - Surfaced Roads by Next Year to Chambers**

Holt county fair-goers this year will not have the benefit of a hard - surfaced highway into Chambers. But next year the story will be different.

People headed to the fair this year via U.S. highway 281, south from O'Neill, will note big changes being made. From the end of the present oil mat, at a point 14 miles south of O'Neill, southward to the Chambers junction (a distance of four miles), a new highway is being built—including new right - of - way, new bridges, new culverts, new grading and latest-type oil mat will be built. The new right-of-way is immediately east of the present graveled highway.

Also under construction is a five-mile section extending from the junction westward to the west edge of the town of Chambers. This also includes a new right-of-way and all the trimmings.

In Chambers itself a new curb and guttering project has been completed and the street has been widened in preparation for the hard-surfacing. This will be the first hard-surfaced street in of the town's history.

West of Chambers for 3½ miles on state highway 95, new grading, surfacing and graveling is under construction.

This road-building activity has now reached the season of the year when it will be a race against the weather. There is some doubt the oil mat will be completed before the snow flies, although all of the work outlined in this story originally was scheduled for completion in 1954.

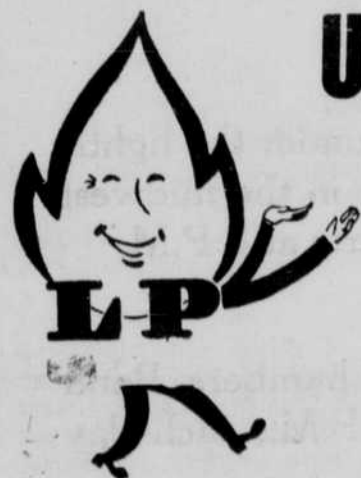
