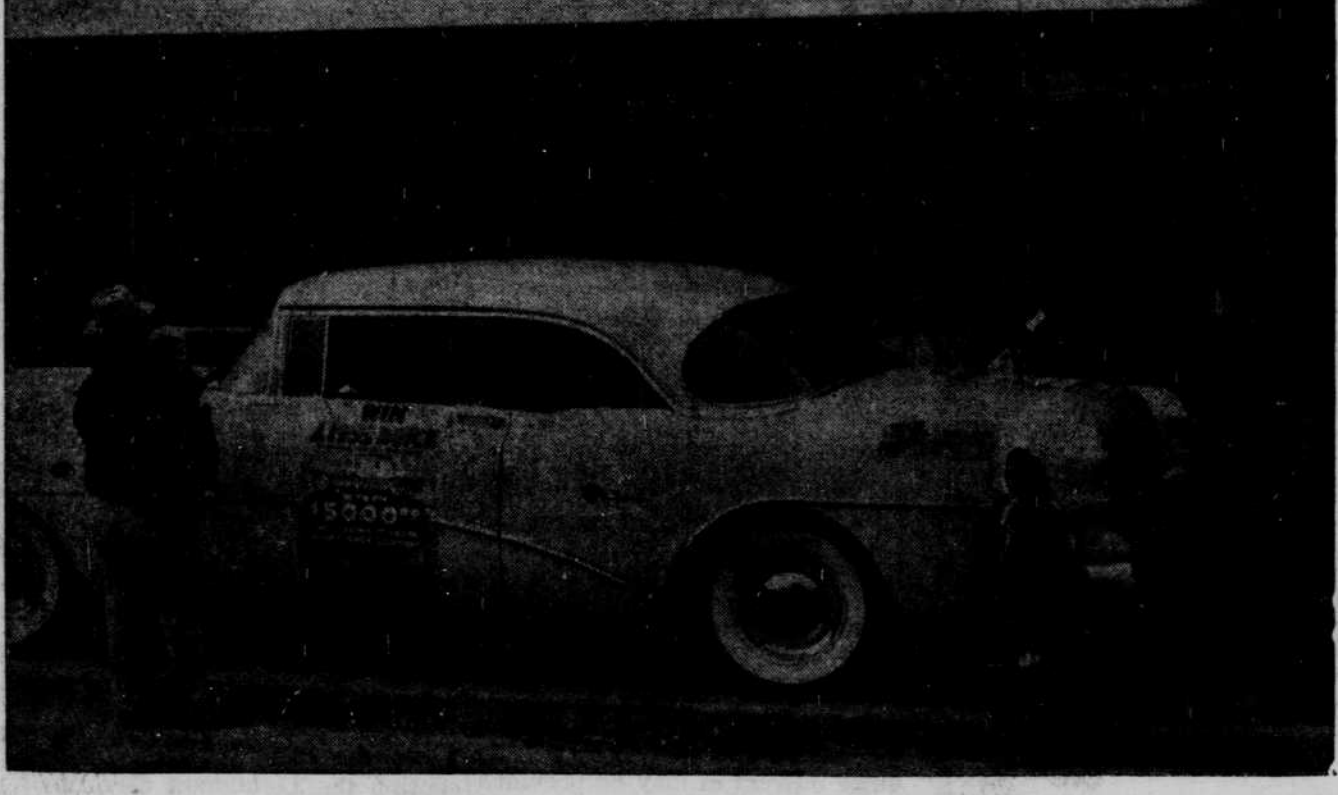
Tomjack said field collections would not begin until after November 1.
