Polish Off Cards 53-42

The Inman high Tigers trailed during the first half Friday night until the final five seconds. They pipped in three points to tie the count, 23-all at the intermission of a heated encounter with the St. Mary's academy Cardinals. After intermission the visiting Tigers moved ahead and won it, 53-42.

The Cardinals pressed to within three points during the third period and trailed 31-35 at the start of the fourth.

Inman went into a stall during the closing minutes, loosening the Cardinal defense. The strategy worked and the visitors racked up some easy late-in-the-game points.

Coach Don Templemeyer's kids hit 43 percent of their field goal tries compared to Inman's 23 percent. But at the freethrow line the story was different; Inman converted 11 out of 23 tries to SMA's two out of seven. It was Inman's second win this season from the Cards.

In the limo, Jerry Hickey dunked in a basket in the last 10 seconds to give the St. Mary's reserves a 33-32 victory over the Inman fledglings. Jim Froelich led the SMA seconds with 11.

The Cards registered their first victory of the season Tuesday night, defeating St. Joseph's hall of Atkinson, 53-30. Significantly it was the Josies' initial setback, and marked the first time in several years in which the SMA crew has been able to deal successfully with the Bluejays.

St. Joe built a 10-6 first quarter lead and enjoyed a six-point spread in the second—greatest advantage either team enjoyed throughout. SMA moved ahead, 19-18, only to have the Josies forge a 20-19 halftime advantage.

The count was tied 23-all in the third; otherwise the Cards stayed in front the rest of the way, relying on control of the ball. It was 31-30 with two minutes remaining.
