Sven Bjork (above) studied music in Stockholm, Sweden, under opera singer Joseph Hilop, who is now at the Royal opera in London. Before moving to the United States, he was soloist for 10 years in the Philadelphia church in Stockholm with 7,000 members, and for many years was the featured singer over the government radio. In 1947 he sang at the Baptist world conference in Copenhagen, Denmark, and in 1949 at the Pentecostal world conference in Paris, France. In 1951 and 1952 he was the soloist for a male chorus from the Mission Covenant church in Sweden, touring Germany and Scandinavia. He was their soloist on a seven-weeks' tour of the United States in the fall of 1954. Mr. Bjork will be at the Assembly of God church Sunday, March 20, at an 8 p.m. service. The public is invited.
