

Thomas Weston Tipton was colorful, vigorous, and unpred-dictable. He was elected to the THE ELKHORN VALLEY senate as a republican. Before the Civil war, he had been a HEREFORD and POLLED whig, as many had been who became republicans during the war years. In later life however, HEREFORD he became a democrat, and in 1880 was the unsuccessful democratic candidate for governor. the Ohio bar in 1844. That same year he campaigned actively for Henry Clay for pres-ident, and the following year he was elected to the Ohio legis-lature.
