**Vet Albion Golfer Wins 32d Tourney**

**Ivan Kaiser, 14, Is Tourney Surprise**

The O'Neill Country club's 32d annual open golf tourney now belongs to the history book, and the new champion is Kermit Mortensen of Albion, who measured O'Neill's A. P. Jaskowiak, 2-1, in the championship flight title match late Monday.

Qualifying matches were played Saturday and the competition morning, grinding through Sunday and Monday. The weather, although there were threatening rain clouds Monday afternoon.

The new champ's father, Chris Mortensen, 68, also from Albion won top honors in the second flight, and a flyweight 14-year-old O'Neill youth, Ivan Kaiser, served notice that he would be an important factor in forthcoming tourneys by breezing through to the title in the third flight.

Although O'Neill golfers predominated in the field of 64, young Kaiser was the only O'Neillite to win a flight. James Clifton of Orchard won top honors in the first flight.

M. J. Golden, O'Neill hotel man who was the defending champion, was ousted in first round play in the championship flight by Thomas Hagerty of Phoenix, Ariz. Hagerty then was

eliminated by John McCarthy of Scottsbluff. Mortensen bounced Edward Campbell, jr., of Green Bay, Wis., in first round play, spanked Jim Burke of Ainsworth in the second, McCarthy in the third, and Jaskowiak in the finals.

Jaskowiak gained the finals by defeating Sid Salzman of Ainsworth, Gaile Whitney of Ainsworth and Henry Lohaus of O'Neill, in that order.

Semifinalists were Jaskowiak-Lohaus and Mortensen-McCarthy.

Golden won consolation play in the championship flight.

Clifton knocked off James Queensberry of Ainsworth, O. D. French of O'Neill, Robert Carroll of O'Neill and Dr. Paul Williams of Decatur, in that order.

The elder Mr. Mortensen, who has been golfing 40 years, grabbed a few catnaps between matches with Harold Petersen of O'Neill, Lloyd Cork of O'Neill, Roy Karr of Spencer and Earl Hunt of O'Neill.

He played 'em straight down the fairway and his consistency paid off.

Young Kaiser, whose diminutive size precludes participation in basketball and football at O'Neill high, eliminated Dr. Edward M. Gleeson of O'Neill in the opening round, blasted William Watson's hopes in the second, polished off Homer Mullen in third flight semifinal play, and nicked John H. McCarville in the finals.
