The managers of the O'Neill Livestock Market are expecting around four hundred head of cattle at the regular weekly auction here today (Thursday). There will be several loads of steers, weighing from 500 to 600 pounds. There will be one consignment of steers weighing around 500 pounds; in addition, quite a few fat cows and a sizeable number of butcher cattle.

We're expecting the usual run of fat hogs and perhaps 200 feeder pigs.

At Omaha Tuesday the cattle market was generally steady while at Sioux City slaughter steers were largely strong to 25 cents higher.
