Young GOP Adopts New Constitution

The Holt County Young Republicans' club held a meeting in the Holt county courthouse on Friday, August 7.

A proposed constitution was presented by Ray Robertson, chairman of the constitutional committee. After minor changes the constitution was adopted. By-laws were immediately enacted to give the club an operative structure.

The purpose of the organization is to bring young people into the republican party, to provide an opportunity for them to find political expression and recognition, to train young people as effective political workers and cooperate in the election of the republican party's nominees, to foster and encourage loyalty to the republican party and to promote its ideals, and to collect, analyze, report and disseminate information concerning government and political affairs.
