1953 for the continued operation of the Office of County Surveyor and that exceptional duties in such office have exhausted the funds available for the operation thereof, and it being determined that an emergency exists to meet the unanticipated requirements of funds for the operation of such office, and that it is essential to the preservation and maintenance of the administration of justice, the public safety, and public welfare within said County that an additional appropriation be made for the maintenance of the functions of said office for the balance of said fiscal year.

**BE IT THEREFORE HEREBY RESOLVED**, that there be, and there hereby is appropriated to the funds for operation of the office of County Surveyor for the fiscal year 1952-53, the sum of \$350.00, from unappropriated funds in the General Fund of said County for said year.
