Weighing Station Now in Operation

Ten state truck weighing stations are in operation, State Engineer L. N. Ress reported last week.

Stations east of Waverly on U.S. 6 and at Hebron on U.S. 81 remain to be opened.

Only stations at North Platte and Holdrege were in operation at the beginning of the year.

Other stations now in operation are at O'Neill, Wahoo, Columbus, Laurel, Nickerson, Oresopolis, Culbertson and Bridgeport.

The so-called O'Neill weight station (named because a highway patrolman is stationed at O'Neill) is located five miles east of Inman at the junction of U.S. highways 20-275.
