Public notice is hereby given that the Mayor and City Council of the City of O'Neill, Nebraska, have, by Ordinance No. 266-A, created Street Improvement Districts Numbered 9, 10, 11, 12, 13, 14 and 15, which respectively consist of the following described real estate set forth at length with respect to each such numbered Street Improvement District, to-wit:
STREET IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT NO. 9
 Street Improvement District No. 9 shall have the outer boundaries and include the area described and established, as follows:

Corn Support \$1.54 Bushel

The support price in Holt county is \$1.54 per bushel and application for loans and purchase agreements may be made from October 20, 1953 through May 31, 1954, at the county PMA office.
 This price is applicable for corn stored on the farm if the corn grades Number 3 of better or Number 4 because of test weight only. Ear corn containing not in excess of 20.5 percent moisture will be eligible for loan until February 28, 1954. Subsequents to that date and until March 31, 1954, corn with 19 percent moisture will be eligible. From then until April 30, 1954, not in excess of 17.5 percent moisture will be eligible.
 During the month of May, 1954, not in excess of 15.5 percent moisture will be eligible for loan. Shelled corn may be sealed at any time on the farm provided that it does not have in excess of 13.5 percent moisture and meets other grading requirements.
 Holt county is in an area where a crib width of 10 feet is permissible. In the case of a round crib, two-thirds of the diameter shall be considered the width unless there is a ventilator, in which case the radius will be considered the crib width. All temporary cribs must have a floor supported above the ground to allow ventilation. Permanent cribs with cement slab floors are acceptable. Additional storage provided in driveways of permanent cribs must have a double wall on both sides of the driveway to allow for ventilation and if the driveway does not have a permanent floor, the temporary floor must be supported above the ground to permit ventilation. Boards of any other material laid flat on the ground will not be acceptable as a floor. All cribs must be provided with a permanent type roof of wood or metal supported above the crib to permit ventilation.
