Bake at 350 F. for 35-40 minutes. Make two 9-in. round layers. Place 1 cup finely chopped nuts eveninly over bottom of 2. well-greased and lightly floured 9" round layer pans. Grate 2 ozs. of sweet or semi-sweet chocolate. Reserve. Sift together 21/2 cups . Pillsbury Best Flour, 41/2 teaspoons double action baking powder, 1 teaspoon salt, 11/2 cups sugar, into mixing bowl. Add 2/3 cup shortening, 11/4 cups milk, 1 teaspoon vanilla. Beat for 11/2 min., 1 150 strokes per min., until batter is well blended. With electric mixer blend at low speed, then beat at medium speed for 11/2 min. Add 2/3 cup egg whites (4 large or 5 medium) unbeaten. Beat for 11/2 min. Spoon 1/4 of batter carefully into each nut lined pan, using about ½ of batter. Sprinkle with grated chocolate (½] in each pan). Spoon remaining batter into pan, spreading so

chocolate is not disturbed. Bake in moderate oven 350 F. 35 to 40 min. Let cool in pan 10 to 15 min, before turning out. Cool thoroughly and frost layers nut side up with chocolate frosting. Spread frosting between and on sides of layers, but frost only 1/2 in. around top edge of cake and about 1 in. in center. Decorate chocolate frosting with reserved 1/3 cup white frosting thinned with 1 to 2 teaspoons water for easy spreading.

CHOCOLATE FROSTING

Combine 2 squares chocolate (or 2 ozs. chocolate), 1/2 cup granulated sugar, ¼ cup water in sauce pan Cook over low heat stirring constantly until chocolate melts and is smooth and thick. Remove from heat. Add 4 egg yolks and beat thoroughly. Then cool. Cream ½ cup butter or margarine and 1 teaspoon vanilla. Blend in gradually 2 cups sifted confectioners sugar, creaming well. Reserve 1/3 cup of this mixture to decorate the cake. Add chocolate mixture to remaining butter-sugar mixture, beat until
