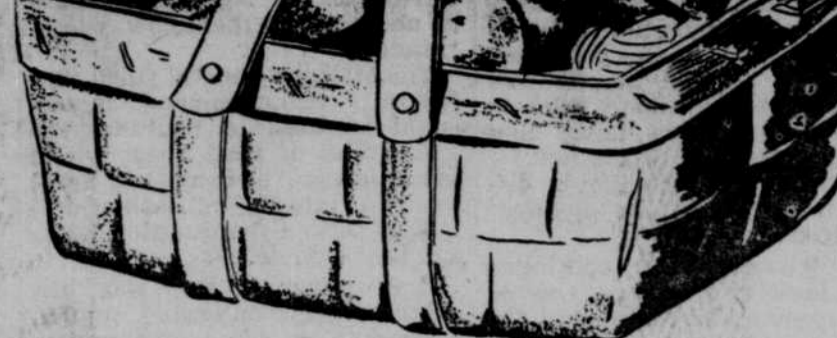

**December 15th Auction**

Cattle receipts totaled 2236 head at Tuesday's auction. Most all classes sold steady to a little stronger on the higher quality kinds which were in very short supply. There was a large crowd in attendance but most of the buyers were wanting stockers and feeders and our run was top heavy with breeding cows.

Choice steer calves sold mainly \$18.00 to \$20.50 with an extreme top of \$22.70 on some 30 lb. weights. Heifer calves cleared mainly at \$14.00 to \$16.00 and again quality was sought by most buyers. Twenty-five head of 470 lb. heifers topped the sale at \$17.20.

There weren't enough yearling steers for the buyers who were on the seats. They sold mostly from \$17.00 to \$19.50. Three loads of long horned yearlings brought \$17.40. Yearling heifer: were again scarce but the packages were quotable from \$14.00 to \$15.50.

Breeding cows were most plentiful, just too many for one sale. The top load brought \$130.00 and the rest ranged from \$90.00 to \$127.50. They lacked the quality of the breeding cows that we have sold for local ranchers in previous weeks.

Canner cows bulked mostly at \$6.50 to \$7.50 with cutters about steady with a week ago from \$8.00 to \$9.00 cwt. Beef cows \$9.00 to \$10.50. Bologna bulls looked 50 cents cwt higher and sold from \$8.00 to \$10.50.
