The funds so collected shall be used for laying out, maintaining, improving and beautifying such parks and for the payment of salaries and wages of persons employed in the performance of labor done in the various municipal activities under the jurisdiction of the Park Board.

Section 4. Any person who shall cut down, injure or destroy any tree, plant or shrub, or who shall injure or destroy any building, equipment or paraphernalia belonging to the city, and installed in its parks or on any other public property used in connecion with any municipal activity under the Park Board jurisdiction, or who shall commit any waste or any kind upon the prop-erty of such activity, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and, upon conviction thereof, shall be fined in any sum not less than \$10.00 nor more than

Section 5. This Ordinance shall be effective from and after the date of its passage and publication as required by law Passed and approved January 14th, 1954.
