Adventures with Recipes—SPICED CHOCOLATE SYRUP DOUGHNUTS

Two cups flour, four tablespoons chocolate syrup (the kind you buy in little cans to put on ice cream), 2 1/2 teaspoons baking powder, 1/4 teaspoon salt, 1/4 teaspoon cinnamon, one egg, 1/4 cup milk, 1 1/2 tablespoons softened butter.

Sift together the flour, salt, baking powder and spices, cream butter and sugar and beat egg well. Mix the chocolate syrup with milk. Combine ingredients, turn out on floured board and roll out 1/4 inch thick. Cut in small, dainty rings, fry in deep fat. Drain on paper, sprinkle lightly, when cooked, with powdered sugar mixed with a little cinnamon.
