1954 ACP Program

Office Manager, Holt ASC Through the 1954 Agricultural Conservation Program, the toderal government will share with Nebraska farmers and ranchers the cost of carrying out approved conservation practices. As the secretary of agriculture, Ezra Taft Benson, stated in pre-senting the 1954 ACP program; "Productive land is the main source of food, clothing, and shelter for the American people. The conservation and improvement of this resource for sustained productive use is an undertaking of vital concern to citizens of all walks of life."

The agriculture department was reorganized late in 1953 by practices for which Federal cost-Secretary Benson as a first step to improve the service being given farmers and ranchers by the various agencies of the department of agriculture. A considerable amount of publicity has already been presented in connection with the reorganization. We wish, however, to deal spe-cifically with the local situation of regular farming operations on as it will affect our own people a particular farm or ranch in the county.

The 1954 ACP program was developed through the cooperative efforts of the state ASC committee, including the state director of extension, the state conservationist of the Soil Conservation Service, and the Forest

> 1. Practices should be confined to the conservation practices on which Federal sharing is most needed in order to achieve the maximum conservation benefit to the county. 2. The county program should be designed to encourage those conservation practices which provide the most enduring con-

able in 1954 on the lands where they are applied.

J. Costs will be shared with a farmer or rancher only on satisfactorily performed conservation sharing was requested by the armer or rancher before the conservation work was begun.

4. Costs should be shared only on practices which it is believed farmers would not carry out to the needed extent without program assistance. Generally, practices that have become a part should not be eligible for costsharing.

5. If the Federal Government shares the cost of the initial application of conservation practices which farmers and ranchers ctherwise would not perform but which are essential to the national interest, the farmers and co-operators as soon thereafter as ranchers should assume responsibility for the upkeep and maintenance of those practices.

The responsibility was designated to the Soil Conservation Service to review and approve need for all of the conservation practices in the '54 ACP program. For certain permanent practices: ie., terraces, dams, waterways, drainage; they are also responsible for layout, supervision, and final inspection as well as certification of satisfactory completion. On other practices, a report is made by the farmer upon completion and spot checks will be made by the county ASC com-

This year there is no provision for payments to be made directly by the federal government to a contractor that may be hired by the farmer or rancher. Operation of the 1954 program provides that practices satisfactorily car-ried out before July 1, 1954, can be certified for payment for the current agricultural appropriation has been passed by the congress. Approved practices completed in the months following July will be certified for pay-

ment in the succeeding month. The following points should be kept in mind:

1. To be eligible for federal cost-sharing, the practices must have been requested and approved before the conservation work is begun.

2. Lay-out of permanent practices by the SCS technicians and inspection by SCS to see that construction meets specifications.

3. Prompt report of compliance on completed approved practices. Individual notices of approved practices will carry date showing termination of approval. The practice must be completed by that date and a report made or else an extension of the approval requested. No cost-share payment can be made for any practice not completed to specifications within the time limit designated

4. Contact the ASC committee or the Soil Conservation Service before any work is begun, if there is any doubt in your mind as to the practice approval or manner in which it is to be carried out


