

## Soldier Born at Orchard Now 'Dead'

Sgt. Billie Cooper MIA Since 1950

ORCHARD — Sgt. Billie J. Cooper, son of Mr. and Mrs. George E. Cooper, route 2, Hoquiam, Wash., has been officially listed as dead, according to word received by the parents from the adjutant general. Sergeant Cooper was taken prisoner in North Korea by the reds December 1, 1950, five months after reaching the Far East.

He had been listed as missing-in-action, but now army authorities have confirmed Sergeant Cooper's death due to "starvation and dysentery."

Cooper, who was 20-years-old at the time of his death, was

born near Orchard on May 18, 1930. He spent the early years of his life in the Orchard and Venus communities, moving to Hoquiam with his parents in 1936.
