**State Legislature to Convene**

**Jan. 3; May be Toughest Session**

LINCOLN—The 1961 Nebraska Legislature opens January 3 for what probably will be a six-months stand. Pre-session indications are that there might not be a record number of bills introduced, but because of some of the problems confronting the lawmakers, they could possibly set a new length record.

Controversial subjects up will be reappointment of Congressional and Legislative districts, broadening of the tax base and the related problem of state spending. Coupled with those will be whether to reform the Board of Control which governs state institutions by changing its structure and whether this would achieve more efficiency.

A group of senators is forming that has in mind a critical look at state spending, including appropriations for the University of Nebraska and the four teachers colleges at Wayne, Chadron, Peru and Kearney.

Governor-elect Frank Morrison says he feels the University's request for 22 per cent more tax money for the 1961-63 biennium, some \$5 million more, is "not too far out of line." Morrison says he wouldn't favor much trimming since he feels it is the responsibility of the elected members of the Board of Regents to run the University. "One place where we cannot afford sacrifice is education," Morrison said.

**New Officers**

Governor-elect Frank Morrison named the bulk of his cabinet level appointments before the Christmas holidays. They included George Morris as State Purchasing Agent; Robert C. Newell of Lincoln as Superintendent of Statehouse and its grounds; Frank J. Barrett, Insurance Commissioner; Joseph Davis, Fire Marshal, and Forrest Johnson as Tax Commissioner.
