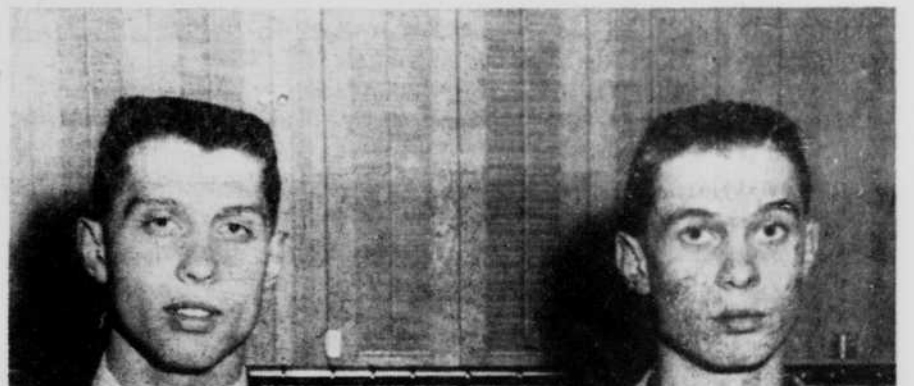
The St. Mary's scoring for the season was as follows: Jim Spitzberger-253 points in 22 games.

Spencer to Lincoln For State Tourney

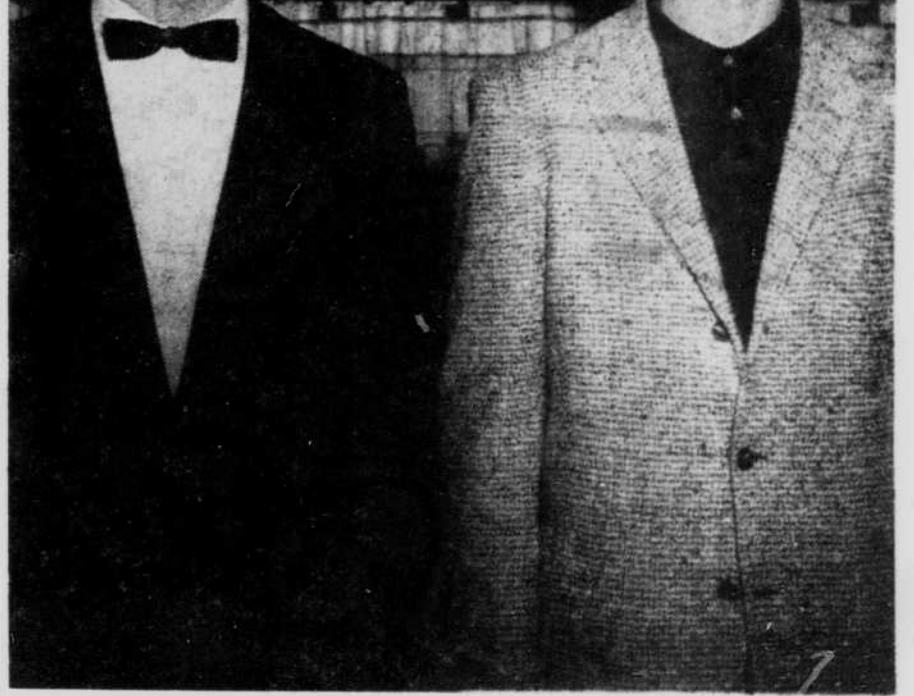
