You and your hospital are in partnership to protect your health, to extend health care to the entire community.

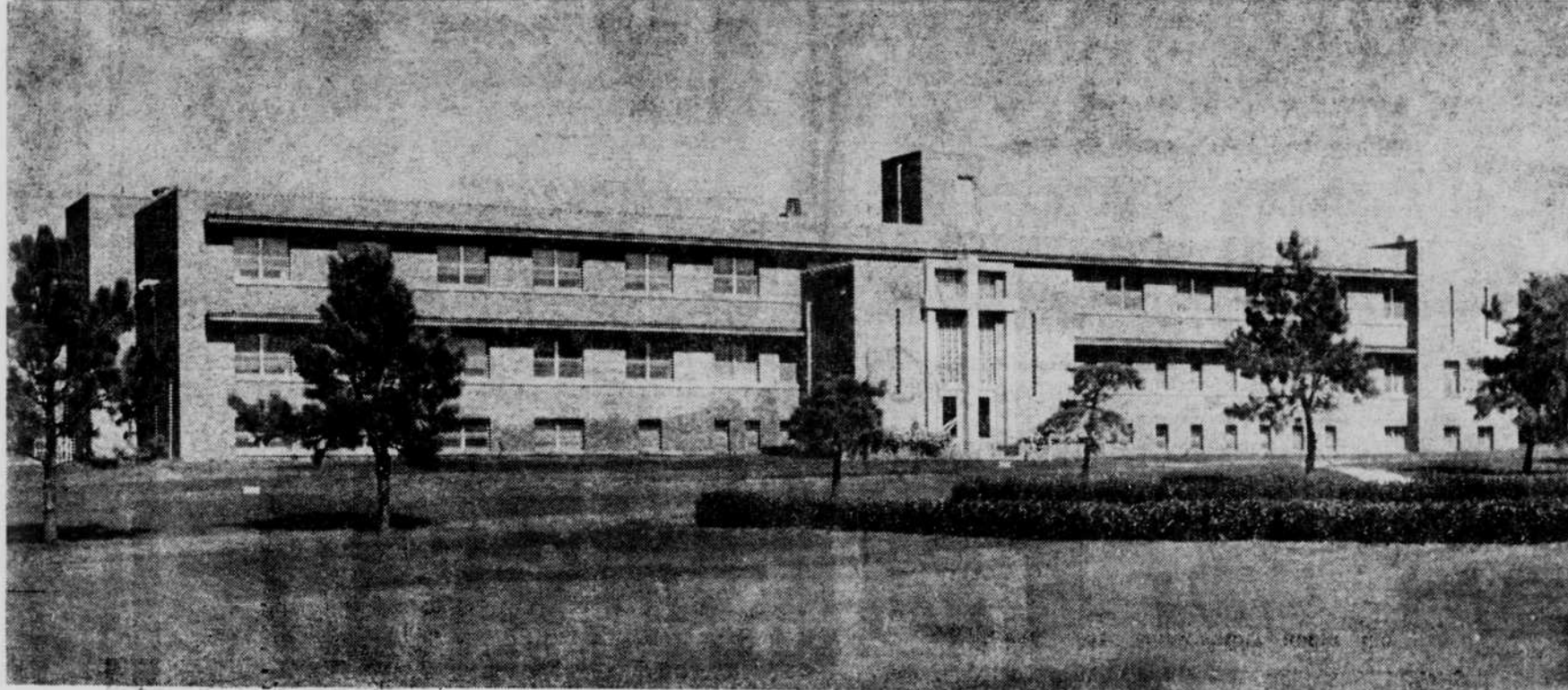
Without the hospital you could not realize your new "heritage of health." Without you and your community, the hospital could not continue to maintain and improve its health and life-giving services.

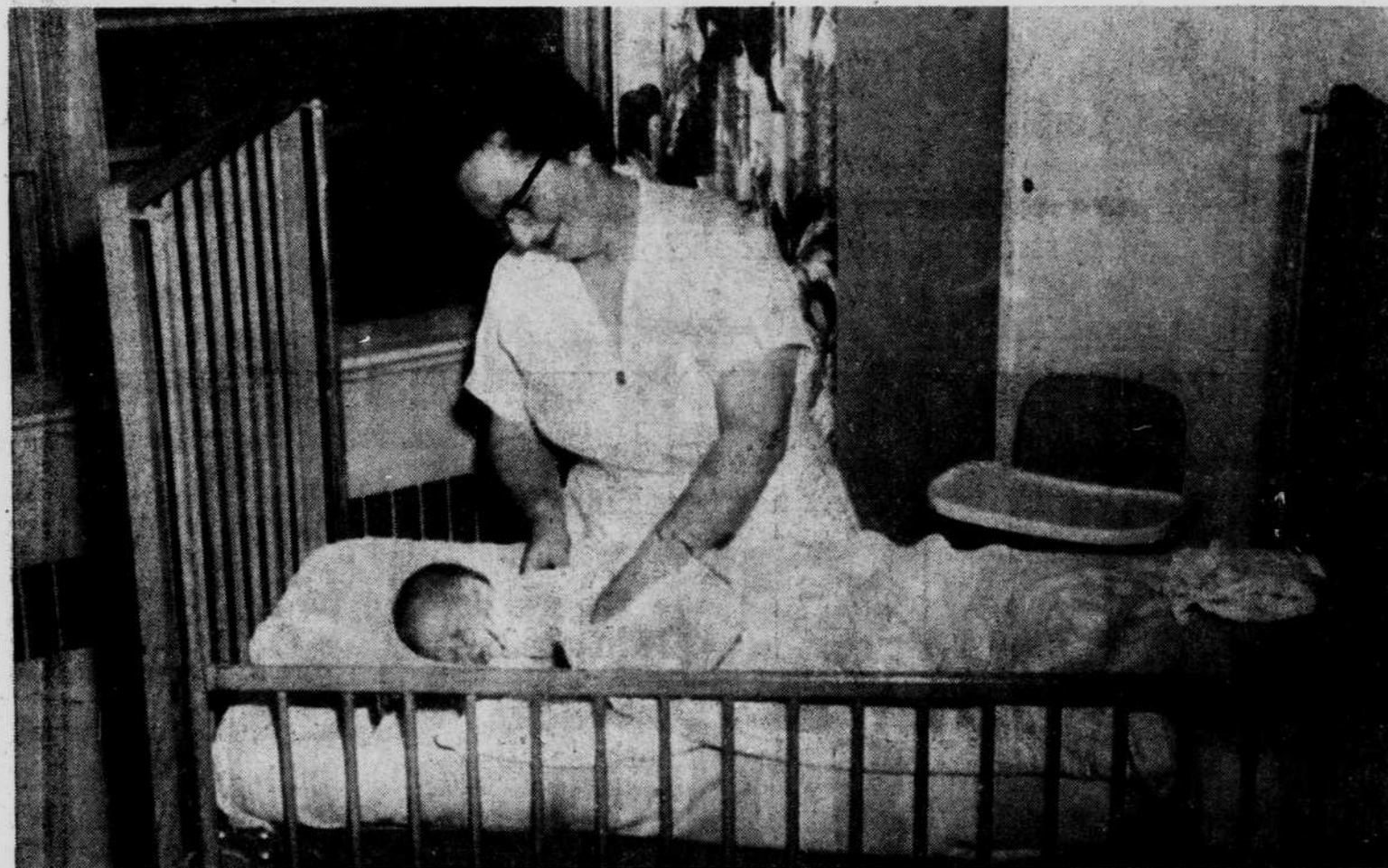

Bright, cheerful rooms assist patients in their recovery with all available conveniences at their disposal.



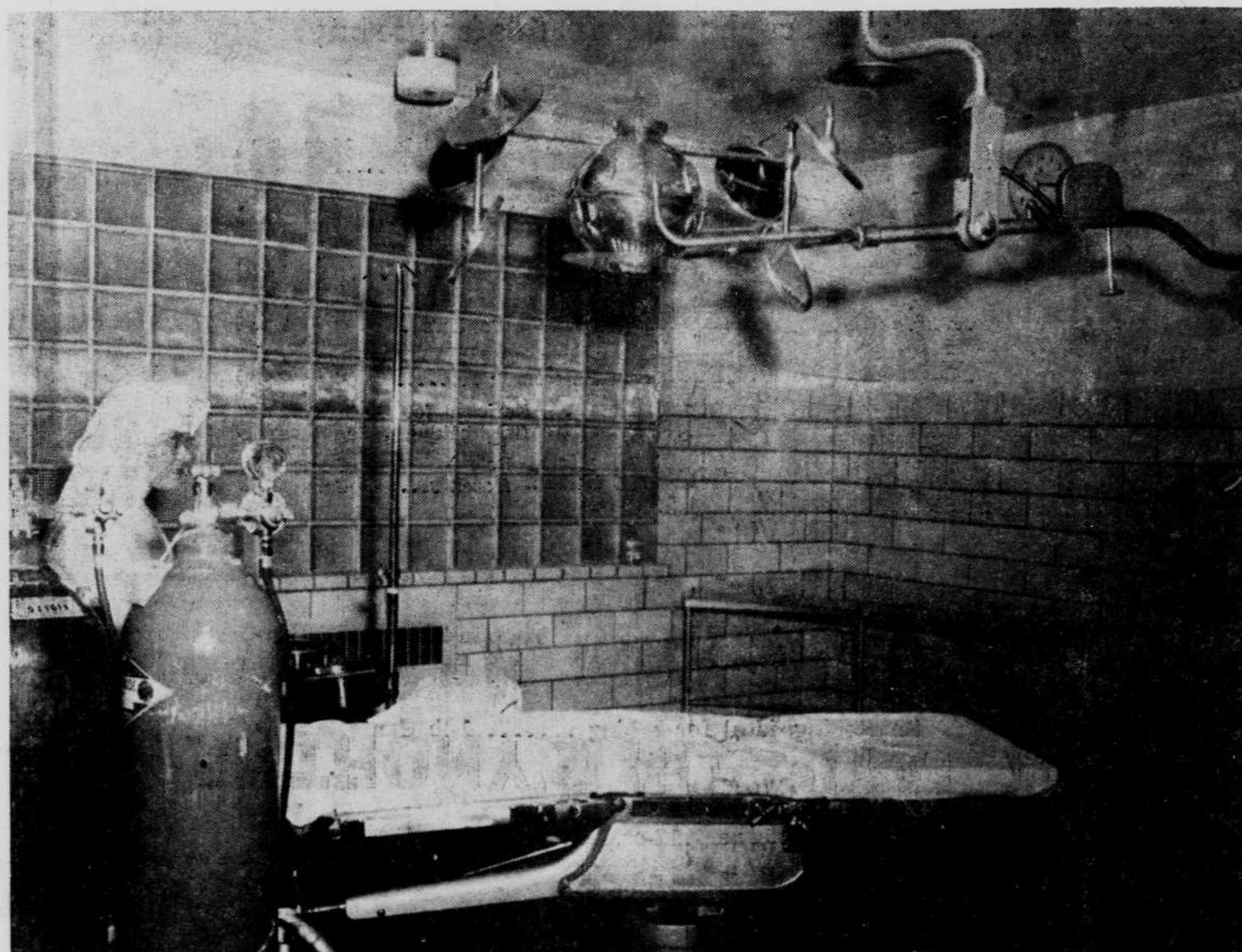

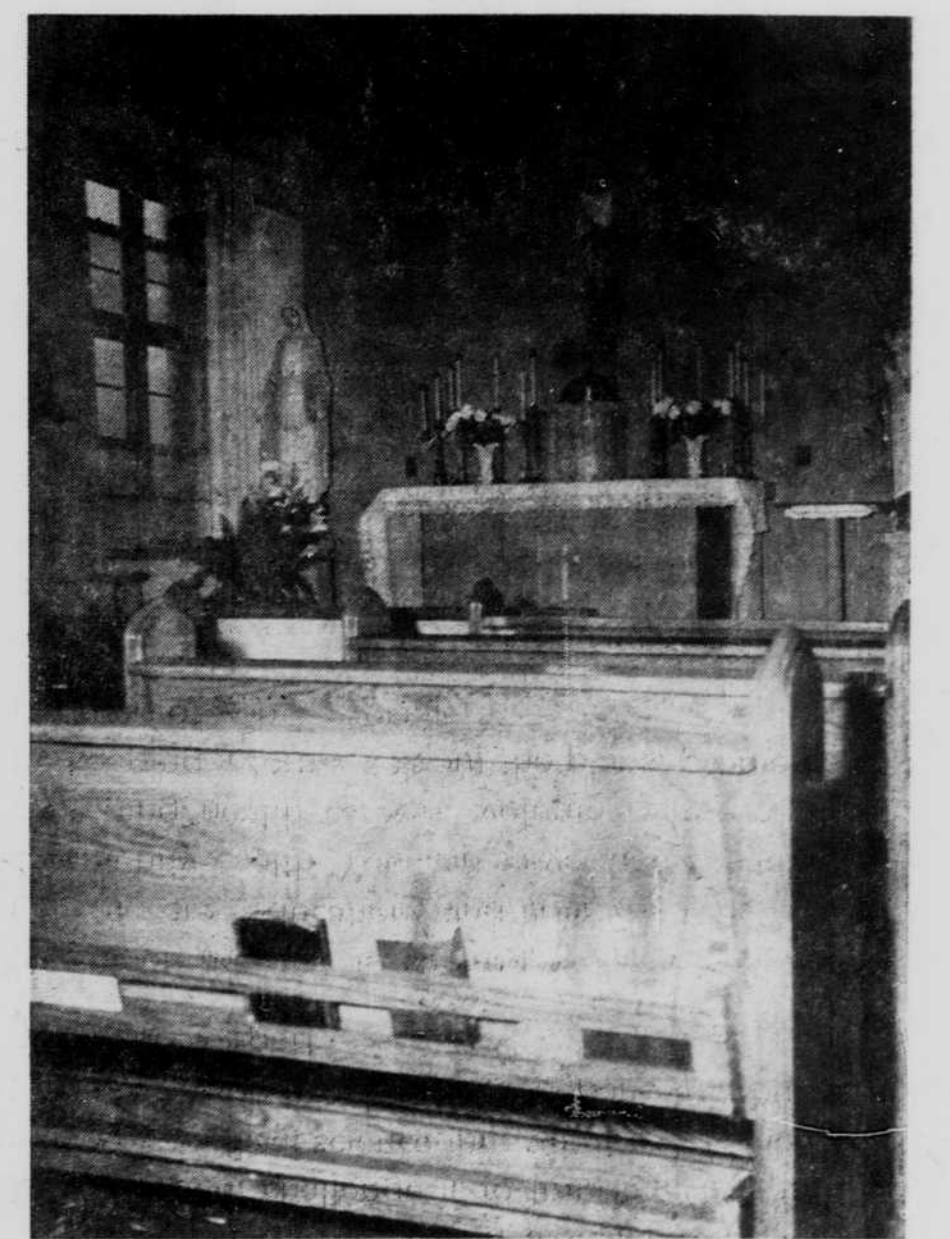
The modern x-ray room at St. Anthony's hospital is equipped with the latest machines. Demonstration is made here of the table used in making x-ray pictures.
