CROP SPECIALS

Range Management Members of the range management and Conservation Clubs may exhibit their individual grass books that are a result of the current year's work. A minimum of 10 grasses must be included in the display. Second or third year grass books that contain previous years project grasses will be judged only on the grasses of the current project year. The grasses exhibited must conform with those required in the project manual and be labeled in the lower right hand corner of each sheet. A short paragraph of about 50 words stating the value and importance on the range land for each of these grasses should be centered on the back of the page opposite of the grass exhibited. Minimum size of the display book is 12" wide and 18" high. Maximum size 16" x 24" high.




