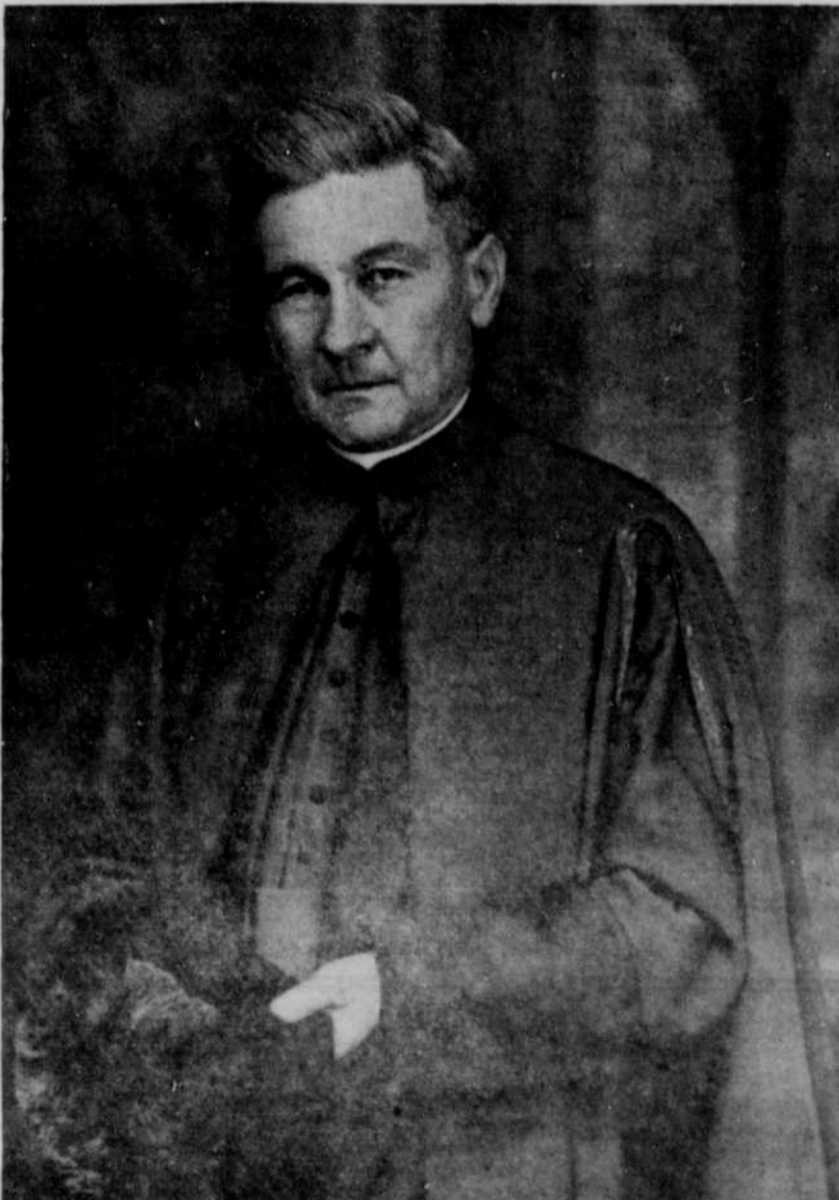

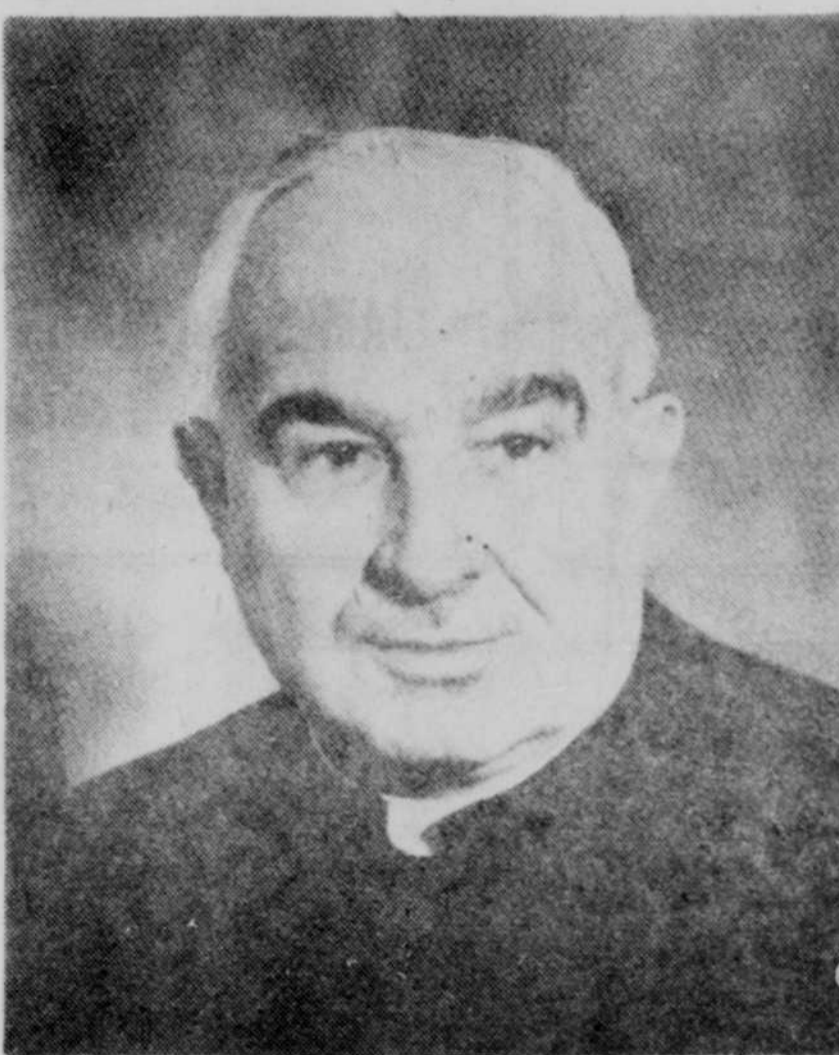
ST. MARY'S SPIRITUAL FATHERS



Rt. Rev. Michael Francis Cassidy ... born in Ireland, he came to O'Neill from Wyoming, became pastor of St. Patrick's Catholic church in July, 1886, died December 2, 1933.



Rt. Rev. J. G. McNamara ... first native Nebraskan to become Roman Catholic priest, succeeded Monsignor Cassidy in March, 1934, died November 2, 1949. He spent over 30 years at Bloomfield.

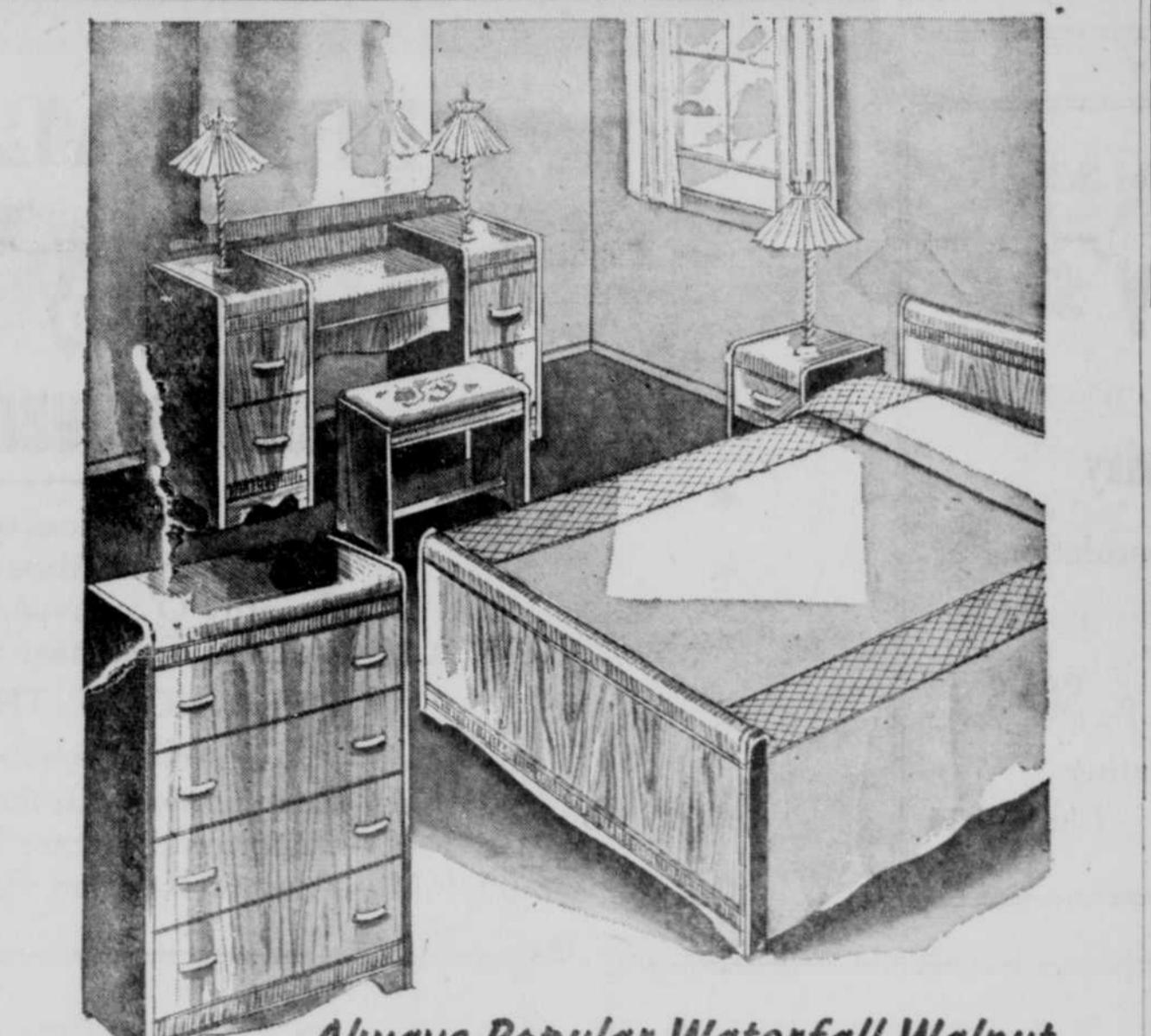

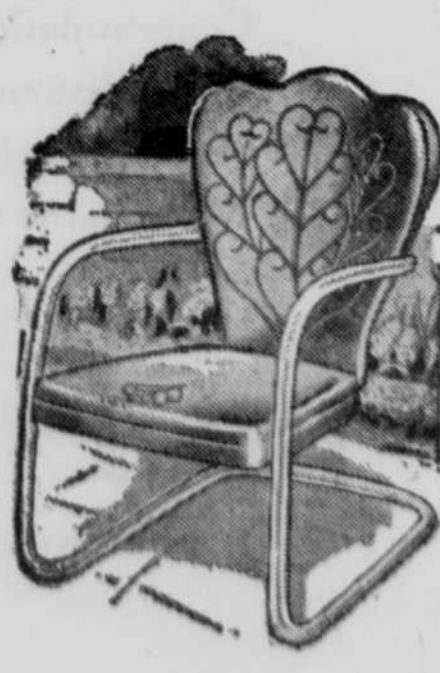
