Hearing held in the Holt county courthouse was 1 of 5 being held in the state by the unicameral legislative council. On the committee were: Sens. William Hern, of Chadron, chairman; Frank Nelson, of O'Neill; Don Hannah, of Valentine; Clyde Cretsinger, of Paxton, Ralph Hill, of Hebron.
Assembly room was inadequate in accommodating the crowd.
Roger Shumate, research director for the council, and Edward T. Gillette, state treasurer and member of the board of educational lands and funds, were present.
"All views expressed were spontaneous," Senator Nelson said.

DOUGLAS, VET MAYOR, RETIRES

Atkinson Physician Helps With Innumerable Civic Projects

ATKINSON — Atkinson's retiring mayor, Dr. W. J. Douglas, has been in-and-out of Atkinson politics for more than 40 years.

He served on the village board shortly after coming to Atkinson from Tilden in 1901. At that time Atkinson was not classed as a second class city as it is today; in fact, it did not enter this class until March, 1915. The late Nels Tuller and Bill Bokoff were other members of the board at that time.

Dr. Douglas was elected to his first term as mayor shortly after returning to Atkinson from his service in World War I, serving from 1920 to '21. He was elected again in 1930 and served until 1946, inclusive, again in 1948 he was elected and will retire in a few days.

During his first years in public office there were no electric lights, there was no city water supply, and there was no sewer system, but Doctor Douglas was anxious to see that the little city he had come to serve should have all of these. He was active in helping bring about these improvements.

The city water system consisted of some windmills, a pump here and there on the street. But today Atkinson boasts the best, both in water supply and sewerage system.

It was during Mayor Douglas's term of office that the new corner stone was placed in the Memorial Hall building by the American Legion. The Legion had purchased the building and turned it over to the city as a

memorial to the boys who died in World War I.

A new jail was built. Jokingly Mayor Douglas remarks it looks inviting but is seldom used. The old one was a tiny 8 x 8 foot building.

Many civic improvements were made through the years and though he was not always directly responsible for many of them, Doctor Douglas was always public minded and served his community well.

One of his pet hobbies was highway 20. He said he thought he talked in every town between Chadron and Sioux City to solicit support.

The mayor's job is a big one—one which takes courage, patience and a thick skin. Atkinson has prospered under his leadership and the community thanks him for his long years of service.

Review Being Sponsored by Methodist Women's Group

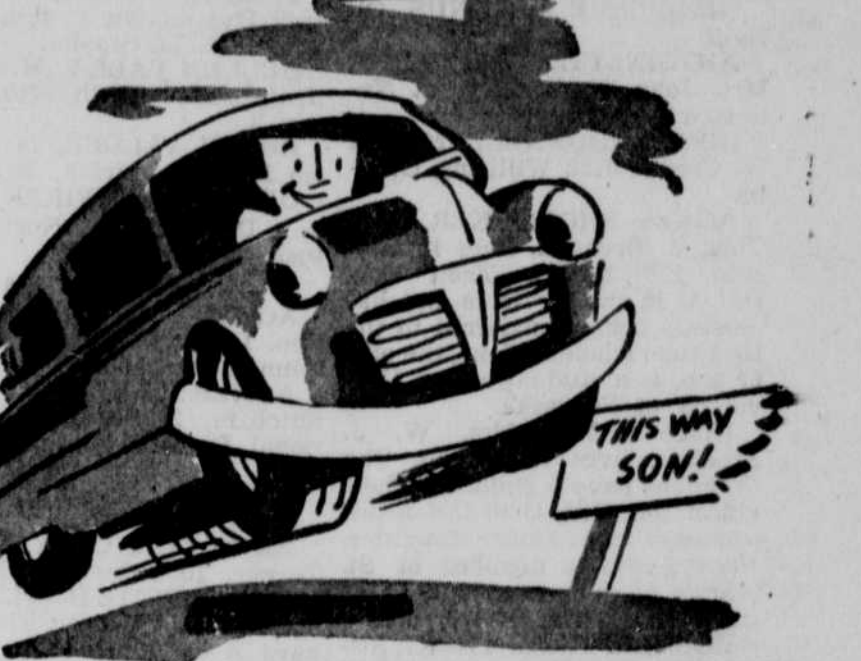
ATKINSON — About 50 wedding gowns will be exhibited in the wedding gown review to be held on Friday, April 21, at the Atkinson high school auditorium.
