Center Firm Gets Graveling Contracts

Three contracts for highway maintenance in Boyd, Holt and Knox counties were awarded Friday by the state highway department.

Brockman Sand and Gravel Corp., of Center, was the low bidder for all 3 of the maintenance gravel surfacing jobs. For the 5 miles west of Verdigris in Knox county, the corporation's low bid was \$1,540. On state highway 12, between Spencer and Verdell in Boyd county, the Center firm is to receive \$6,088.80 for laying gravel on 24 miles. A \$3,294.40 contract is for graveling the 16 miles of highway south of Lynch in Boyd and Holt counties.

Well over 6-thousand cubic yards of gravel will be laid on these 3 projects.
