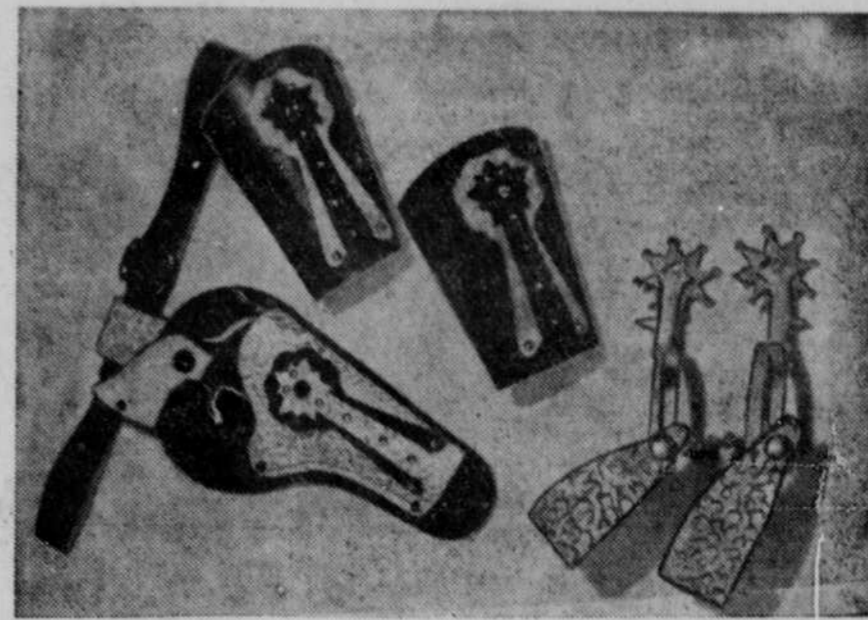
"This set of books consists of several groups, suitable for all children from the very small ones to those in the early teens," M. S. Davis explains.
