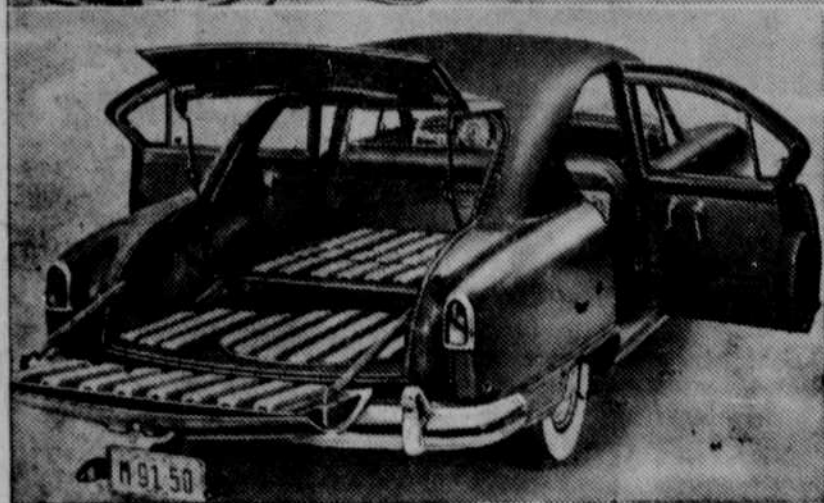
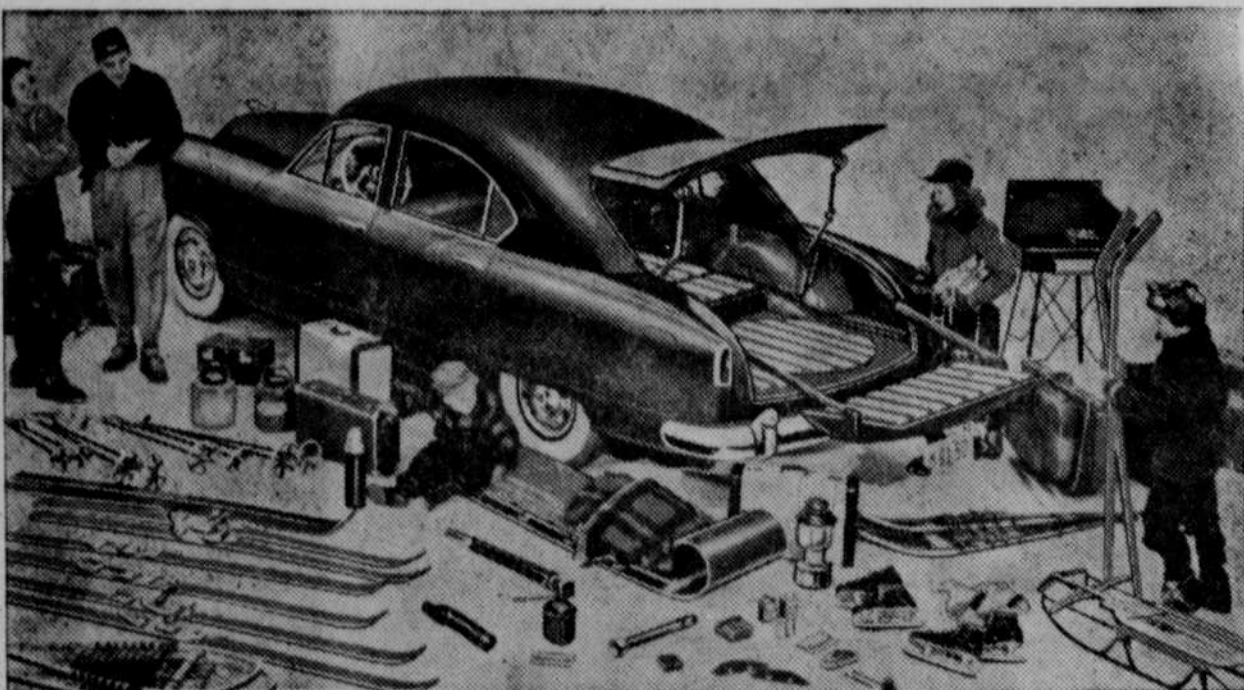
**'Making Aluminum Trays' Meeting Topic**
